

April 14 - Deborah De La Torre & Ben Raznick -- "Action Steps
Toward Becoming Anti-Racist in the Private Music Studio"
We are witnessing protests across the world fighting for systemic changes and accountability for the way people of color are disenfranchised in our communities. We see this too in our music communities, whether we take a look at the amount of students of color each teacher has, the

diversity we have within the membership and leadership of our organization, or the amount of composers of color we include in our curriculum. We don't realize how our private music teaching contributes to systemic racism. Repertoire lists without pieces by composers of color means students will lack awareness of them. This is how "cultural erasure" works. Composers and their works that are continuously absent from catalogues and competitions lead to the assumption that such music simply does not exist. We believe this important work can be addressed through intentional action steps.

Bio: Deborah De La Torre has an award-winning music career as a pianist, composer/arranger, educator, Latina/o art festival founder, documentary film producer and recording artist/producer. She received her Bachelor's degree in Music from the University of Miami, Florida, and her MBA in Business Administration from Regis University in Denver. She is passionate about Caribbean, Latin American and Spanish/Iberian musicology, performing as "La Cocodrila" (the lady crocodile) on account of her fierce playing style.

Bio: Ben Raznick is a pianist, composer, recording artist and teacher from Colorado. He has trained with piano professors in the US, Argentina, Brazil and Spain. Raznick was selected as a 2x semi-finalist of The American Prize in 2019. He is a recipient of Steinway & Sons prestigious Top Music Teacher Award in 2017, 2018 & 2019, and affiliate faculty at MSU. Raznick's solo piano classical album, Birds of a Feather, features a professionally edited video performance of each work.

International Festival for Creative Pianists

The 2021 Festival is totally virtual this year...and we now have International involvement and enrollment. Martha Hill Duncan, our Clinician coaching composition is from Canada. We currently have 14 students enrolled from around the US, and more to come. A student in North Carolina studies via Skype with a teacher in Russia.

A Special Gift to Teachers: Teachers with one or more students enrolled in the Festival will be

automatically enrolled as a LifeLong Learner. As an enrolled student of the Festival it will be possible to participate in all activities of the Festival, including submission of a composition.

<u>Three Age Categories: Budding Pianists (12 & under), Teen Pianists (13-19), Lifelong Learners (20+)</u>

Since we are totally virtual we are using tools which increase the learning activities and opportunity for personal involvement with our Judges and Clinicians. We have expanded this pool to include 15 talented and very exciting educators.

We are managing the enrollment in MyMusicStaff and will launch online learning activities in OpenLearning starting April 1st. There will be Workshops, Group Coaching, Private Coaching, and Written Composition coaching and submittal.
